## **Captain's Report October 2023**

### **Coming Events**

October 7th Monthly Medal -Stroke

October 14th Fourstomes Championships – Played with a partner. One player drives from the odd tees and the other from the even tees. After the drive players take alternate shots until the ball is holed. Penalty strokes do not alter the order of play. This means that a player never plays two consecutive shots. All players play from the black tees.

October 21st Holt Shield named in honour of our Honorary Life Member, Past President/Captain, Club Manager and all round "good bloke" – this is a fourball better ball stableford event. Partners play their own ball and record the best stableford score for each hole. The best score for the day wins the Holt Shield. Players can choose the tees colour they hit from but both players play from the same tees.

October 28th Presidents Cup. This is one of our major events. I am sure most regular members have no idea of the amount of time and effort our current President, Tommy has put into getting our golf club back on track. He puts in many hours every month to ensure things run smoothly, often donating his company's time and resources to repair the roof, the sewerage system etc, etc.

Swan Cup match play rounds are underway. Round 2 matches need to be completed by the end of September. The Pennant Season for Northwest Pennant start on Sunday the 7th of January next year. We need three players in four grades. A Grade handicaps in the 4.5 to 9.4 range, B Grade handicaps in the 9.5 to 13.4 range, C Grade handicaps in the 13.5 to 17.4 range and D grade 17.5 to 27. A, B and C Grade play off the stick, D Grade give/ receive strokes using match play index. Women are eligible to play this year. If you are interested in playing, please put you name in the book in the Pro-shop. Brodie and Connor will be the organisers this year. The rules of play and a copy of the draw are also in the book.

A reminder to please rake the bunkers after you have been in them, not just the area you play from but the footprints you leave walking in and out. The bunkers are raked on Friday afternoons using the bunker bike. We do have green fee players out on the course late on Fridays and believe it or not they do not always rake up the bunkers. If you notice any areas unraked during your competition round, think of the players following and give any nasty areas a rake over if you have time.

#### Information on Bunker Play

If bunkers are deemed as Unusual Course Conditions (G.U.R) there will be signs up in the Pro-shop. It is not compulsory to take relief but if you do - you need to take a drop at the nearest point of relief no closer to the hole, (not the nicest point of relief), and not at the point of entry (unless it is also the nearest point of complete relief). This might mean that you have to play over the bunker. If there are Drop Zones marked you must use the one closest to where you ball lies not the one you like best for your game. You are allowed to remove loose impediments in a bunker, (stones, gumnuts, etc). There is no penalty for touching the sand with your club unless you are doing so with the intent to test the conditions of the sand. You are also allowed to rake a bunker while waiting for others to play as long as you are not improving conditions for your shot or testing the conditions of the sand near your ball.

The Match Committee is in the process of reviewing the Local Rules. When completed the updated version will be posted on the notice board outside the Pro-shop. We will also email all members a copy. Some Local Rules are on the back of the card but the ones on the notice board are more detailed. Every player should be familiar with the Local Rules and the Rules of Golf for that matter. They are available in the form of an app. (search for Royal and Ancient Rules of golf).

Remember to keep filling divots even if they are not your own and repair pitch marks on the green, yep even if somebody else was too lazy to do their own.

## **Greens Report October 2023**



Please be aware that the irrigation system is always in a state of repair, with over 200 hundred sprinklers throughout the course likely to break down or at least cause concern. Again, bear with us as repairs are being dealt with.
